Your Choice to Live, Inc. is a State of Wisconsin certified community substance abuse prevention program under DHS 75.04.



Sandi, Rick, Ashleigh and Tyler Lybert, the founders of Your Choice, along with other Your Choice speakers, work with families, speak at schools and give presentations about their own experiences involving substance abuse. Your Choice provides an array of services to students, parents and community members. The Your Choice youth speakers speak in assemblies as well as classroom settings, sharing their experiences and stressing the hardships and devastation that drugs and alcohol can do to a person and their family. The Stairway to Heroin Educational Series is offered for parents, families and community members. The Stairway to Heroin Educational Series is a four-part prevention model designed to address the ongoing substance abuse epidemic adolescents and young adults are facing today. Lastly, Rick and Sandi Lybert meet with families and provide guidance and assistance getting family members help who are struggling with a child to get the help that they so desperately need.

Mission

It is our mission to provide awareness, prevention education, resources and support to youth, parents, schools and communities in regard to alcohol and drug use. Through these educational and prevention efforts, we will help shape healthy, responsible and successful future generations who are equipped with the necessary resiliency and decision making skills to make good choices in all aspects of their lives.



Message from the Executive Director

Dear friends, colleagues, and supporters of Your Choice to Live, Inc.,

Your Choice to Live, Inc. seems to grow in both number of programs and participants in attendance each and every year. The 2017-2018 school year was no exception. This year we provided 216 programs to 47,000 students, parents, teachers and community members.

Here are some of my favorite highlights from the year:



Our youth presenters, Tyler, Katie, Melanie, and myself traveled to 35 different school districts throughout Wisconsin and into parts of Illinois and Indiana to speak to over 15,000 students.

Stairway to Heroin, Deadly Decisions and Playgrounds to Pills programs continued to be strong, reaching over 2,500 attendees in 8 different school districts. 99% of attendees believed the presentation was effective in providing awareness and education about the topic.

The demand for our Wake Up Call program far exceeded our expectations. We were able to provide 17 public tours, 4 private tours and 32 auditorium style presentations, reaching over 2,700 attendees

Because the demand grew so fast, we developed a Wake Up Call training manual and trained 23 people to provide Wake Up Call in their communities. In addition, we created an amazing Wake Up Call Parent Handbook which is a great resource guide for parents.

Other highlights include:

- Subcontracting with Waukesha County Health and Human services to provide Narcan training.
 During the 2017-2018 school year, we trained 950 people in opiate overdose awareness and how to administer Narcan and distributed 895 Narcan kits
- Your Choice was a part of the channel 12 State of Addiction segment which won an Emmy
- Sandi Lybert, founder of Your Choice, won "Champion of the County" at the Waukesha County Executive Awards



PLAYGROUNDS TO PILLS

Every day in the United States, 2,500 youth (ages 12-17) abuse a prescription pain reliever for the first time. Why do some adolescents make decisions that lead to risky behaviors such as substance abuse? For some, it may be out of curiosity or peer pressure, but for others it may be a coping mechanism for an underlying issue such as anxiety or depression. Playgrounds to



Pills addresses those questions and impresses upon audiences the power of parents in prevention and early intervention. Participants will learn the importance of developing strong relationships with their children as well as strategies for raising resilient children despite the societal pressures placed upon them by technology and media. This program targets a younger population, specifically parents of those in 4th-9th grades.



WAKE UP CALL

This is a life-sized exhibit of a teen's bedroom with more than 20 "red flags" that can signal drug or alcohol use. The bedroom identifies spots where teens may hide drugs, household items that can be used as drug paraphernalia and ways teens try to cover up drug and alcohol use. It is important for parents to know what to look for in their own homes before alcohol and drug use escalates to other risky behaviors or addiction.



DEADLY DECISIONS

Young people between the ages of 18-24 are already at a heightened risk of addiction so the availability and accessibility of many kinds of drugs is truly frightening. Increasing overdoses and the growing heroin epidemic have forced high schools and college campuses to begin coming to the realization that substance abuse problems don't just revolve around alcohol and marijuana. Everyday decisions made by young adults surrounding the choice as to whether to use or not can have fatal consequences and can lead to broken lives and shattered futures.

LYBERT FAMILY

Your Choice was founded by the Lybert family – Sandi, Rick, Ashleigh and Tyler. The Lybert's work with families, speak at schools and give presentations about their own experiences involving substance abuse.

Tyler's drug use escalated, from alcohol and marijuana to pills and heroin. He was in and out of jail. His family life deteriorated from the stress of his drug use.



During presentations, Ashleigh speaks about the pressure to be the perfect sister in light of her brother's addiction and feeling neglected by her parents. Rick talks about being angry that his son couldn't conquer his addiction, and Sandi explains how she enabled her son to the point that her marriage nearly crumbled.

Tyler entered treatment at age 21 and has been sober since 2008. The Lybert's are passionate about communicating their story and removing the stigma of teen substance abuse in hopes of helping other families.

NARCAN TRAINING

Your Choice to Live, Inc is assisting with Waukesha County's plan to reduce the number of opioid overdose deaths in the county by offering free trainings open to all county residents on the administration of naloxone, a drug that can reverse an opioid overdose and distributing free kits containing naloxone to county residents. This is funded by a grant provided by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services. The state received a grant from the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration to prevent prescription drug/opioid overdose related deaths.



The Lybert family can share their personal experiences one on one with a family in need. Our goals for this discussion is to let struggling families know that they are not alone and to encourage them to openly talk about the problems they are facing and how they can work to resolve them.
